Sermon Recap:

The Armor of God: Shield of Faith

If we are going to stand firm on the day of evil, against the schemes of Satan, then we must have a living and active trust in God.

I. What is the Shield of Faith?

Biblical faith contains three elements: knowledge, assent, and trust.

a. Knowledge

• Faith starts in the mind. Faith knows the Word, relies on the Word, and believes the Word.

b. Assent

• Faith is present in our hearts. The knowledge in our mind is accepted, welcomed, and received in our heart. It goes beyond knowledge to a conviction of the certainty of truth.

c. Trust

This conviction plays out through the will as faith consists of a personal trust in Jesus Christ.

II. Why Do We Need the Shield of Faith?

a. Armor of Armor

- The soldier's shield protected all other pieces of armor.
- We can never have sincerity, righteousness, peace, or salvation without faith. Faith protects all
 other characteristics and disciplines of the Christian. It is absolutely paramount and essential in
 the believer's life.

b. Quench Darts

- The shield of faith extinguishes the hail of fiery darts that Satan rains down on believers.
- Common arrows being fired by Satan: doubt, fear, despair, accusations, false teachers/doctrine, sinful desires and passions.
- Faith protects the believer from the burns, wounds, and death of these fiery darts.

III. How Do We Take Up the Shield of Faith?

a. Hear the Word

• Fill your heart and your mind with the word of God. Hear the word, so that your faith will be strengthened.

b. Pray to the Author

 Prayer is an expression of faith. It is a display of laying down our self-righteousness and independence and surrendering to him in a trusting faith.

c. Stand Together

- Soldiers would interlock their shields to protect one another.
- Christians need one another. We need community and fellowship in order to encourage and strengthen the faith of one another.
- We stand together in faith to protect our brothers and sisters.

d. Look to Christ

- Christ is the object of our faith.
- Our circumstances may change and attacks may come, but Christ remains the same forever.
- By accepting this knowledge as absolute certainty, we can trust in his person, promises, and presence in all circumstances.
